Brief Overview

Expo Carleton 2020 will be operating fully online this year. Taking place on Tuesday, September 8th from 12pm – 4:30pm, Expo will give clubs, societies, and services the opportunity to show not only the incoming class, but all Carleton students, what they offer.

Our new virtual format will showcase our clubs, societies, and services by giving you a space to provide a description of who you are and what you do, upload a video of your club/society/service welcoming the incoming class and introducing who you are, as well as providing students with a one-stop-shop to figure out how to contact you. We are also exploring the idea of having a virtual Live Expo – this would allow students to pop in and ask you questions as they would in person!

Video Component

One of the greatest things about Expo is the ability for students to see how friendly and welcoming all of our clubs/societies/services are. To allow students to see who you are, what you do, and welcome them, we're encouraging all of you to record brief welcoming videos! The video needs to be under 1.5 minutes (90 seconds) and will have to be submitted by **August 7th**. An example of a video could be having your club President welcome the class, explain what your club does, and then current members of the club could record them saying welcome! Please be mindful that these videos should be respectful.

Description Examples:

Carleton University Biomedical Engineering Society: Carleton University Biomedical Engineering Society (CUBES) represents the undergraduate students enrolled in Biomedical & Mechanical and Biomedical & Electrical Engineering. Fair Trade Carleton University: Fair Trade Carleton is a student volunteer group on campus with the goal of raising awareness among staff and students of the fair trade movement. Our members are passionate about human rights, ethical consumption, and environmental issues, and we are always looking for like-minded individuals to get involved.
