Dr. James Orbinski

Dr. James Orbinski is a globally recognized humanitarian practitioner and advocate, as well as one of the world's leading scholars and scientists in global

health. After extensive field experience with Médecins Sans Frontières / Doctors Without Borders (MSF), Dr. Orbinski was elected MSF's international president from 1998 to 2001. He launched its Access to Essential Medicines Campaign in 1999, and in that same year accepted the Nobel Peace Prize awarded to MSF for its pioneering approach to medical humanitarianism, and most especially for its approach to witnessing. Dr. Orbinski is a Senior Fellow at the University of Toronto's Massey College, the Munk Centre for InternationalStudies, and practices clinical medicine at St. Michael's Hospital.
