


Why Study European and Russian Studies?

A Wealth of Possibilities!

When you are part of EURUS at Carleton, you have many ways to expand your learning. Our special offerings include:

- **Two Paths to Learning:** Students may choose to take either a EURUS BA or the specialization in Europe and Russia in the World under the Bachelor of Global and International Studies (BGInS).
- **First-Year Seminars:** Small classes for Bachelor of Arts students modelled on the seminars offered in later years. Students discuss and conduct research topics in a core subject area.
- **Carleton University Research Opportunity (CUROP):** A summer opportunity for students to work closely with a professor on a research project of their choosing.
- **IPAF 4900:** A credit course in which students gain experience while assisting with a professor's research.
- **Co-op Option:**
Placements available in the federal government, non-governmental organizations, embassies and more.
- **An International Perspective:** EURUS provides travel support to encourage research in Europe, Russia or Eurasia and to help students learn relevant languages in the countries of the region.
- **Internship:** Qualified fourth-year BA Honours students from EURUS are also eligible to apply to the Institute's internship program. This is an excellent opportunity to gain practical, hands-on experience while earning academic credit.
- **EU Study Tour:** The European Union (EU) Study Tour is an initiative of the European Studies Network (Canada), a consortium of Canadian universities of which Carleton is a member. The Tour consists of 21 days in Europe, involving meetings and consultations at a wide range of European institutions in locations like Brussels, Strasbourg, Luxembourg and Frankfurt. Students participating in the Tour may also apply to participate in an internship program (2 months or more) with a European institution.
