Required Academic Qualifications and Skills for FREN 1001, FREN 1002, FREN 1100, FREN 2100

The required minimum qualification is an MA in French Studies or Applied Linguistics. However, a PhD in French Studies or Applied Linguistics will normally count as a superior qualification. For degrees in French Studies, given the nature of our French language program, a degree specialization in language pedagogy/teaching or applied linguistics will normally be considered as more relevant to the position than a degree in formal linguistics or literary and/or cultural studies. Experience in developing course content, activities and assessments for language courses is a desirable asset. Native or near-native fluency and excellent written skills in French are required. Candidates should also possess a strong written and spoken knowledge of English (the working language at Carleton University). Applicants must be legally entitled to work in Canada and available to lecture, conduct office hours, attend meetings and report in person on campus as required. The required teaching experience is specified for each course below.

FREN 1001, 1002, 1100 and 2100 are multi-section courses with common course materials and exams and guidelines determined by the Language Course Coordinator.
