## Instructions

This board aims at visualizing and exploring further the theoretical territory of the research. An example template has been provided on the left. Please fill in the blank template on the right.


1) Write the core research topic (i.e. Playing in marginalized places) in the triangle at the center;

2) In the three boxes connected to the triangle, identify the **methods/tools** concerned with the core research topic and the theory (i.e. Design experiments); 3) Identify three main theoretical topics that converge into the core research topic. Write each one of them in either the yellow, blue and orange circles (i.e. Decolonial Design). If you need more fields, use some of the green circles and change their color;

4) The area between two main theoretical topics is the area of the **sub-topics** that concern those two main topics. Identify them and write them in the green circles. I.e. The area of knowledge that concerns Participatory Design and Decolonial Design in the project of the example provided has the following sub-topics: culture and identity; activism; children multiple voices, etc. If you need more fields, copy some of the green circles and add them to the dotted circle. Make the dotted circle bigger if necessary, but keep all of the coloured circles on the dotted circle;

5) In the grey circles identify the **scholars** of reference for each theoretical topic and methodological approach;

6) In the smaller grey circles add the **full reference** and connect it with the scholars' field. You can enlarge the circle if necessary.
