DGES invites applications from members of the CUPE 4600 (Unit 2) bargaining unit and other interested persons to teach courses in Geography (GEOG), Geomatics (GEOM), or Environmental Studies (ENST) as a contract instructor (CI) during the Fall 2024 and Winter 2025 terms. The specific courses requiring CI's are listed below, and calendar course descriptions are linked to the course numbers.

The modality of this course is determined by the University (in-person, online, or hybrid).

We welcome inquiries on how these courses fit into our programs' learning objectives, and this will be a topic of discussion between potential instructors and the departmental Chair. Detailed course scheduling is not known currently. When it is, we will make all efforts possible to accommodate CI schedule constraints. Due to the short turnaround time we will have for such requests, it would be appreciated if applicants could include any firm constraints in their application materials.

Qualifications

A Masters degree in Geography, Geomatics, or Environmental Studies, or a related discipline, is the minimum requirement to be considered for these positions. Previous work or research experience in the subject area is required; demonstrated evidence or potential for teaching excellence is required; previous teaching experience in the subject area will be considered an asset. CI stipends are \$8,637 per 0.5 credit course (all courses in this posting are 0.5 credit courses).

How to Apply

Applications should include: a cover letter, a CV, a list of all courses taught at Carleton, evidence of teaching competence (including previous teaching evaluations at Carleton or at other institutions), and the contact information for two references. This application package should be sent by email to: Geography_JobApplication@carleton.ca. Please indicate in the subject line the course[s] for which you are applying.

Incumbents should note the following from Article 15.3(a) of the collective agreement: "When applying to classes for which they have incumbency, applicants shall not be required to (re)submit documentation beyond their updated CV."
