<b>Course Title</b>	Maps, Satellites and the Geospatial Revolution
<b>Course Description</b>	Introduction to the creation and use of maps using a variety of geospatial tools to better understand and resolve physical, social and environmental problems. Overview of geomatics (cartography and map design, geographic information systems, GPS, remote sensing).
<b>Course Credit Value</b>	0.5 credit
<b>Anticipated Modality</b>	In-person <b>Delivery:</b> Lecture (1.5hrs twice per week/daytime hours), Labs (2hrs per week-varied times)
