Nomination

Deadline: Fall semester and Full
Year: March 31

Students will receive an email with a link to the online application form after the nomination deadline and will have to apply before the application deadline. Students can expect their offer letters by the end of June for September entry.

Application

Deadline: Fall semester and Full year: April 30

Once a student receives the link, they can start the application process, documents to submit:

- Passport (valid for the whole period of exchange)
- Most up-to-date official Transcript of Records (ToR), signed and stamped
- English Language Proficiency (ELP) document, if required

Requirements

Study requirement - Students must have completed at least 2 semesters of their home university degree before starting their study abroad or exchange programme at the UoB.

Modules

Exchange students must study 60 UoB credits per semester and 120 UoB credits per full academic year.

The University is structured around five Colleges, four of which are open to Study Abroad and Exchange students (College of Medicine and Health is currently excluded). Students need to select their host school and preferred college, which is relevant to their study plan. At least 40 credits per semester should be selected within the preferred College but can be in multiple Schools within that College.

The four Colleges that are open to Study Abroad and Exchange students are:

- College of Arts and Law
- College of Engineering and Physical Sciences*
- College of Social Sciences
- College of Life and Environmental Sciences

Exams

Examination dates at the UoB are different in each College and depend on the modules students choose. The assessment periods take place in January and June for full year students. Most schools offer alternative assessments for students who attend the first semester only. Second semester only students must complete their assessments in May/June.

Transcript of Records

The official transcript will be available via the Gradintelligence system within 5 working days after a school releases results. ToRs can be viewed, downloaded and shared with a home coordinator via Gradintelligence. All documents that you will receive from [Gradintelligence](#) Document Services are genuine and officially verified.

Students will no longer receive a hard copy of their transcript unless requested.

Living expenses

Housing

The cost of living in Birmingham is low when compared to some other major cities like London and Edinburgh. It will depend on several factors such as the type of accommodation, the amount spent on food, travel, clothing, and social activities. You can find more information [here](#).

Study Abroad and Exchange students coming to study at the UoB for a full year, are guaranteed the opportunity to book a room in university accommodation providing they register by the given deadline. We also have a dedicated number of rooms available for Study Abroad and Exchange students studying at the UoB for one semester only. Additional information can be found [here](#).

Health & Insurance

We recommend that you purchase health insurance before you travel and arrive in the UK. The University has a health centre close to campus, and you should register with this service when you arrive.

If you are in the UK for more than six months, you will be able to use the National Health Service in the same way as anyone permanently resident in the UK. However, pre-existing medical conditions requiring long-term medication or hospital treatment may not be covered. Repatriation would also not be covered; therefore, we recommend getting health insurance before you arrive.

If your course lasts six months or less, you will be treated as a private patient and will have to pay to see a doctor. The charges for this can be especially high if you need medication or hospital treatment. Dental and optical treatment must also be paid for, as is the case for those permanently resident.



Visas

All students coming for one semester are sent a Standard visitor visa letter that also has details regarding the new Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA), this letter is issued by UoB after you are unconditionally accepted). All students coming for the full year must obtain a student visa and you are sent a CAS number for your student visa application (issued by UoB after you are unconditionally accepted).
