Nomination and application



Fall/First Semester From September to January

Start of Nomination Period	March 16 th
End of Nomination Period	April 20 th
Deadline for Submission of Documentation	May 15 th



Spring/Second Semester From February to June

Start of Nomination Period	June 1 st
End of Nomination Period	July 15 th
Deadline for Submission of Documentation	September 1 st

The deadlines to request extensions for existing students are the same as the nomination deadlines corresponding to the desired period.

Required documentation



- Photocopy of passport valid for the duration of your stay.
- Photocopy of academic transcript of your studies at home university.
- B2-level Spanish Certificate is required for non-native Spanish students. For non-native English students, a B2-level English Certificate is required.
- Photocopy of valid medical insurance in Spain.

Integrated Programmes



Nebrija University offers a range of Integrated Programmes corresponding to each faculty of the university.

Students are permitted to choose subjects of different degrees offered within the integrated programme.

In order to take the courses taught in Spanish within the programmes, a minimum level of B2 Spanish is required (this requirement applies only to non-native speakers).

In order to take courses taught in English within the programmes, the home university must verify that the student has a minimum level of B2 in English (this requirement applies only to non-native speakers).

Our international programme is taught in-person, and therefore both lectures as well as exams (mid-terms, regular and re-take exams) require physical presence at their corresponding campus and classrooms.

Students in Integrated Programmes are permitted to enroll in one semestre-long class of Spanish language, courtesy of our Hispanic Studies Centre.



Hispanic Studies Programme



This programme offers Language, Conversation, Culture and Literature courses offered at all levels, from beginners to native-level speakers.

The Programme is taught at our Princesa Campus or at a support building on Calle Vallehermoso, located approximately 5-10 minutes' walk from the main campus.

No prior knowledge of Spanish is required to join this programme.

Life in Madrid

Madrid is a vibrant and friendly city for international students.

Living costs can vary, but on average, it is estimated that a student needs around 900-1,200 euros per month to cover accommodation, food, transportation and personal expenses. Housing in student residences or rooming in student flats can be more economical than living on your own.

In addition, there are student discounts for public transport, museums and cultural activities. It is important to plan a budget. Enjoy your experience in Madrid!

General Visa Information:

If you are a citizen of the European Union, you will not need to apply for a visa. Students from outside the EU will need to apply for a student visa at the relevant consulate several months before their arrival in Spain.

Important: The Office of International Mobility will not be responsible for delays in the processing of student visas.

Medical insurance:

All exchange students must have a valid medical insurance for the duration of their stay as a student.

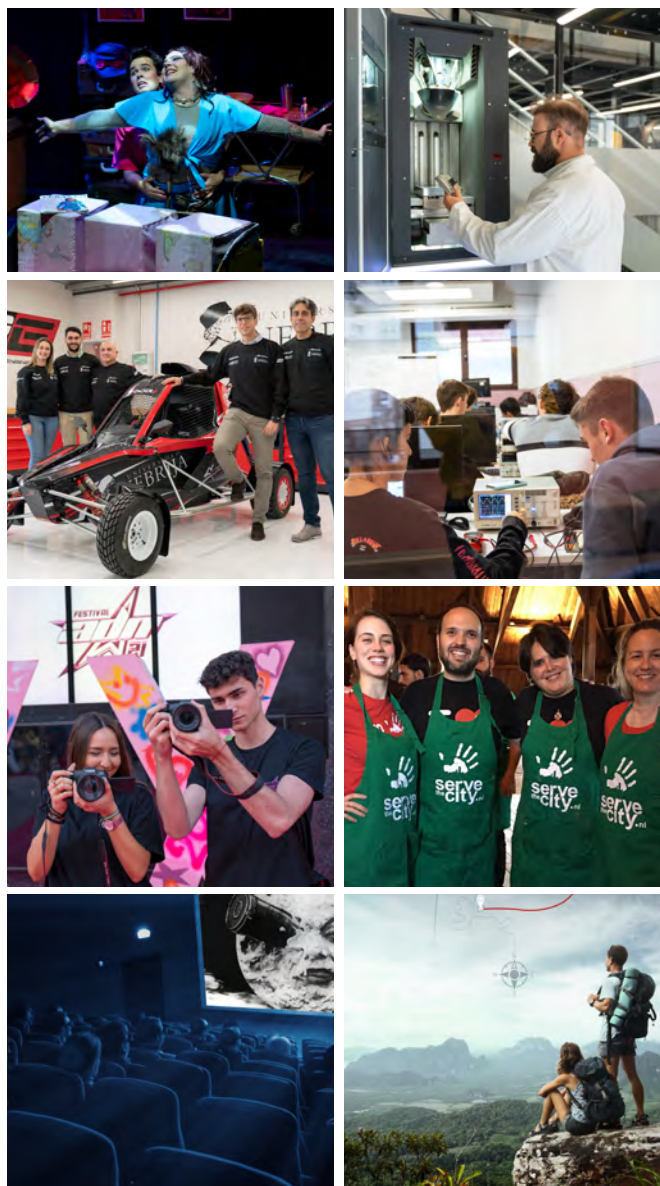
If you are an European Union citizen, you can apply for the European Health Insurance Card. If your country is not part of the European Union, you will be required to obtain a private medical insurance valid for the duration of your studies in the host country.
