Language requirements	Proof of English proficiency (minimum B2 level in the CEFR): letter from home institution if all courses are taught in English or one of the following tests* *For students from institutions where the language of instruction is not English.	- TOEFL: minimum required 79 - IELTS: minimum required 6.0 - Cambridge English certifications: Cambridge First Certificate (CFE), Certificate of Advanced English (CAE), or Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE).

Course selection	IUM offers predetermined undergraduate and graduate programs. Courses cannot be mixed across programs. With their home institution's coordinator, students select one program and choose courses within it.
Credits	IUM uses the US credit system. 1 credit per approximately 15 contact hours.

Student services	If you need a visa, information on how to get to Monaco, where to live, open a bank account and other helpful information to move to Monaco, visit our student services web page . Or read our student guide
Visa	Most of our students live in France, therefore for non-European students, a Long Stay Visitor visa (called VLS-TS type D visitor visa) has to be requested to the French Consulate or Embassy of home country. An invitation letter from IUM is provided in the application procedure. For those who plan to live in Monaco, a student visa for Monaco has to be requested to the French Consulate of home country.
Accommodation	The International University of Monaco does not offer an on-campus accommodation option. Students are responsible for finding and paying their own accommodation. Our student services office offers support in this matter. Rooms in shared flats and studios. (Average price: private single room: 650 - 800 €, flat: 800 - 1200 €)
Insurance	A health and accident insurance as well as a liability insurance coverage are required to study in Monaco and live in Monaco or in France. Our student services office can recommend insurance companies, but it is your responsibility to check all terms and conditions and make sure you are fully covered.
Arrival to Monaco	The nearest airport to Monaco is Nice Côte d'Azur Airport, in France. From there, you can reach Monaco in about 30 to 45 minutes (bus, train, taxi, and helicopter).
Transportation to Monaco	The International University is a few minutes' walk to the train station and bus stops. It is very easy to commute every day. For instance, a ride between Nice and Monaco takes only 20 min by train (about 44 trains per day).
Student associations	IUM Students Associations organize sporting events, debates, and recreational activities every day. From sports to finance and entrepreneurship, IUM offers a wide variety of clubs.
