

Trip to Turkey & Greece

May 4-24, 2015

Estimated cost: \$4000*

Course Description:

CLCV 3400A will be a concentrated study course in which students will be expected to participate in some preliminary lectures before departure and 21 days of travel in Turkey and Greece. Course content will concentrate on ancient Greek and Roman archaeology, history, art and religion, including early Christianity.

There will be required sessions at archaeological sites and museums each morning and most afternoons. These will include lectures by faculty, and time to explore sites and ask questions. There are also optional activities such as more strenuous hikes and visits to additional places of interest.

The group stays in 3 star hotels which are clean and comfortable but not luxurious. They include private bath, air conditioning, and continental breakfast. You will be carrying your own luggage. Cost is based on double occupancy but single or triple rooms may be available. We travel by foot or public transit within cities, and by chartered bus to other destinations.

Prerequisites: 1.0 credit in any courses offered by Greek and Roman Studies or permission of the GRS Program

Requirements:

- assigned readings
- 3 preliminary lectures at Carleton
- participation in all required activities in Turkey & Greece
- take-home final exam
- trip journal (notes and observations)
- research essay submitted one month after return to Ottawa. Topic approved by professor.
- Students must provide evidence of supplementary health insurance for travel outside Canada. Other travel insurances may be purchased with payment.

*Dates and cost are best estimate *at this time*. Final price and dates will be available in early 2015. Cost includes round-trip airfare, all transportation within Turkey and Greece, lodging, breakfast, and entrance fees. It does not include lunch, dinner, spending money, or the cost of university registration. A non-refundable deposit will be due in December 2014.

- 13 Priene, Miletus site & museum, temple of Apollo at Didyma
- 14 Mausoleum & Museum of Maritime Archaeology in Bodrum / Halicarnassus
