

GUIDELINES:

FINAL RESEARCH SEMINAR (HLTH 5905/6905)

Each graduate student must give a final oral seminar of their thesis project within one month of their oral examination/thesis defence (this can also happen earlier if approved by the GAC).

This departmental seminar will be open to the public and the broader University committee.

The 1-hour seminar will consist of a 45-minute presentation followed by a 15-minute question period.

If this presentation is successful, the student's supervisor will give a SAT for HLTH 5905 (MSc) or HLTH 6905 (PhD).

At the beginning of the final term of the MSc or PhD, the student must consult their supervisor to determine if they will be ready to submit their thesis and defend by the end of the term. If this is the case, the student can proceed with the planning of their Final Research Seminar (HLTH 5905/6905)

The student must be sure to register for HLTH 5905 (MSc) or HLTH 6905 (PhD) before the last day of registration (<https://carleton.ca/registrar/registration/dates/academic-dates/>)

The student must be in touch with the Grad Admin, who will help with scheduling and advertising for the seminar.

One month prior to the thesis defence, the student will present their Final Research Seminar.

Upon completion, the student will be given a SAT for the successful completion of HLTH 5905/6905
