Dear Mr. Sprecher:

We shall be pleased to communicate with your cousin, Mr. Jesse Fabia, regarding affidavits of support in behalf of yourself and your two brothers. We wonder whether you have answered your cousin's inquiries which are contained in his communication to you under date of April 16.

We would also appreciate it if you would give us further identifying information regarding your background and that of your brothers so that at the time we approach Mr. Fabian we will have all the material available which is essential for the purpose of filling out an affidavit of support. We should like to have your full names, dates and places of birth, occupations, present addresses; you might also give us the names and addresses of your parents, the dates and places of their births and occupations. Will you also advise us as to the dates when you arrived in England and Canada. We would be interested also in knowing whether you were working during the time that you lived in England, and the nature of your employment.

As you no doubt know, in addition to an affidavit of support, it is also essential for you to secure a morality affidavit which will attest as to your loyalty and integrity, from persons in the United States who are American citizens and to whom you are known.

We wonder whether you have discussed your immigration problem with the Central Committee for Interned Refugees. We would suggest that you do so since they have a representative visiting your camps and we know that he will be glad to guide you with regard to your immigration problem.

As soon as we receive the desired information, we shall then be pleased to approach your relative in your behalf.
