

## Opting out of RAMQ

Residents of Quebec are automatically registered for prescription drug coverage under the RAMQ public plan when they turn 65. Residents may instead choose to opt-out of RAMQ, choosing the Carleton group benefits plan to be the only payer for drug coverage.

If you choose to opt-out of the RAMQ drug plan, you may continue coverage under your currently Carleton group benefit plan, with the following additional monthly premiums paid by you:

Additional premiums for coverage if you opt out of RAMQ:

Single coverage - \$200.00

Family coverage - \$400

*(premium subject to change)*
