We have a few opportunities: 1) volunteer locally with Inuuqatigiit's Tukimut after school program in Ottawa; 2) volunteer with our Indigenous Mentorship Program to rural communities near Ottawa; 3) travel on one of our week-long trips (for example to Moose Factory, ON, Cat Lake First Nation, ON Sanikiluaq, NU, or Waswanipi, QC).
