PATHS TO INFRASTRUCTURE SECURITY AND RESILIENCE PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

The certificate and professional designation programs are aimed at security professionals, managers, frontline responders, operational personnel, young professionals, and recent graduates looking to improve their knowledge and skills to advance or pursue a career in security and critical infrastructure.

Certified Security and Resilience Professional (CSARP)

The Certified Security and Resilience Professional Certification (CSARP) is granted when an individual attains 12 “certificates of completion” composed of:

Credit Equivalencies

- and/or
- Two (2) **published articles per year in the Online Journal** (Infrastructure Resilience Risk Reporter)

Each of the above is equivalent to one (1) essential credit course

Designated Security and Resilience Manager (DSARM)

The Designated Security and Resilience Manager (DSARM) is granted to an individual who has successfully:

1. Completed six (6) essential courses
2. Completed six (6) elective courses
3. Passed the testing requirements; and
4. Acquired the CSARP status by taking the following courses:
 - Values and Ethics
 - Legislation and Regulatory Framework
5. Passed the board examination / interview

CONTINUING DESIGNATION REQUIREMENTS

To maintain the Designated Security and Resilience Manager (DSARM) status, the following is required:

- Attendance at any **two** of the following IRRG Events per year:
 - Symposium
 - Dean’s Lecture
 - Workshop
 - Speaker Series
- One (1) Article** for publication in the IR³ Online Journal
