### PATHS TO INFRASTRUCTURE SECURITY AND RESILIENCE PROFESIONAL RECOGNITION

The certificate and professional designation programs are aimed at security professionals, managers, frontline responders, operational personnel, young professionals, and recent graduates looking to improve their knowledge and skills to advance or pursue a career in security and critical infrastructure.

Certified Security and Resilience Professional (CSARP)

The Certified Security and Resilience Professional Certification (CSARP) is granted when an individual attains 12 "certificates of completion" composed of:

- Any six (6) from the following list of essential courses:

- And, six (6) elective courses (offered by IRRG and its partners)

Successful completion of the requisite test for each essential and elective course is a 70% minimum passing grade

- 5. Passed the board examination / interview
