Founded in 1948, Strathclyde Business School is a pioneering, internationally-renowned institution that shapes and develops the business minds of tomorrow.







Strathclyde Business School is a tripleaccredited business school holding accreditation from the international bodies AACSB, EQUIS and AMBA, and is proud to be among only 1% of business schools in the world to have achieved this recognition. We are the largest business school in Scotland and were the first Scottish business school to gain full international accreditation.

SBS is one of four Faculties at the University of Strathclyde alongside Engineering, Science, and Humanities and Social Sciences. In recent years the University has won awards for UK University of the Year, Scottish University of the Year, and European Entrepreneurial University of the Queen's Anniversary Prize in recognition of world-class excellence and achievement. In addition, SBS has held the award for UK Business School of the Year, and was the first in Scotland to be awarded the prestigious Small Business Gold Charter Award.

## **SCOTLAND**


Home to some of the most magnificent landscapes in the UK, and with Glasgow as a base, you are only a short journey from exploring everything Scotland has to offer.








Our campus is right in the centre of the city, just a short walk from two mainline railway stations, the bus station and the subway to help you get around the city and to visit the rest of the UK.

## INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE AND STUDY ABROAD

Strathclyde Business School has over 100 exchange and study abroad partner institutions worldwide. Every year, we welcome hundreds of students to the Business School for their international experience, making it a dynamic and cosmopolitan place to study.

**Exchange** students can study for one semester or for a full year at Strathclyde Business School and must be nominated by their home institution. Modules in all academic disciplines in the Business School are open to exchange students.





If your home university does not currently have an exchange agreement with us, you can still join us for one semester or a full year as a **Study Abroad** student. There is typically a fee attached to the programme, and you will have access to a wide range of classes across the Business School. #### **MODULES**

Modules at Levels 1, 2 and 3 are open to exchange and study abroad students. Modules at Level 4 (Honours Undergraduate level) may be available if students can demonstrate significant previous study in the subject, but restrictions will apply.

Modules at Level 1 are generally at an introductory level. At Level 2, students are likely to require some previous background in the subject, and Level 3 typically will require intermediate knowledge of the subject. Students and partners are encouraged to check module descriptors for details of prerequisite knowledge.



#### **WORKLOAD**

A regular full-time workload at Strathclyde University is 60 credits (30 ECTs) per semester, and in the Business School this typically equates to 3 modules per semester. Students attending for a full academic year normally register for 120 credits (60 ECTs). Most students take a full workload, but the recommended minimum workload for exchange and study abroad students is 40 credits (20 ECTs).
