Candidates should hold at least an M.A. degree in a law field or an LL.B./J.D., and have particular research or employment experience in a relevant field. Priority will be given to candidates with higher research degrees and teaching experience at the university level.

NOTES:

The University may require that all or part of any of the below courses be delivered remotely, including online.

The university is planning for return to in-person face-to-face courses for some courses in the Fall 2021 semester (with a maximum enrollment of 60 students in these courses). As a result, some sections of LAWS 2000 courses have been designated to be taught as in-person face-to-face courses. In addition, sections of 3000 and 4000 level courses in the Fall term may also be designated to be taught as in person face-to-face courses.
