

POST-DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP

Located on the unceeded and unsurrendered territories of the Algonquin Anishnabek of Kitigan Zibi, the Prison Transparency Project (PTP) is a SSHRC funded partnership grant comprised of a collective of scholars, activists, advocates, allies, and watchdogs from Canada, Argentina, and Spain who are embarking on a seven-year study of prison transparency. We seek a highly qualified post-doctoral fellow (PDF) to join our team for a two-year term beginning in April 2024. The successful candidate will ideally have completed their PhD or have a defense date scheduled.

JOB DESCRIPTION

Reporting directly to the Primary Investigator and two co-Investigators, the PDF will be involved in all of the PTP's research-related activities including:

- Field work
- Archival research
- Knowledge mobilization (including web-site development and podcasting)
- Liaising with partners
- Writing (single and co-authored) articles and briefs
- Public lectures
- Field work travel and work exchange

DESIRED SKILLS (training provided)

- Comprehensive knowledge of systems of incarceration and detention in at least one of our sites (Canada, Spain, or Argentina)
- Understanding of issues related to immigration detention
- Community-engaged / -led research
- Field research, data collection and management
- Conversant with Nvivo
- Deep familiarity with abolitionist and critical perspectives on incarceration
- Ability to produce knowledge outputs that reach non-academic audiences

- Ability to live in Canada at least part time
- Fluent in English, passive bilingualism French, knowledge of Spanish an asset
