The department is requiring **additional documentation** from applicants for any course they are applying to teach **for which they are not an incumbent**. In addition to the standard updated CV:

1. You **MUST** upload a cover letter with your application. The cover letter must include a paragraph of no more than 250 words for **EACH** new course, detailing how your qualifications are relevant to the course topic and
2. You **MUST** upload a copy of your highest degree obtained in the field of law with your application. This could include an M.A. or Ph.D. in the field of law or an LL.B./J.D. A scanned copy or photo will be accepted as long as it is legible

Ensure your application is accurate and complete. **The department will not be responsible for any inaccurate or incomplete applications.**

A note to all applicants: As per Articles 16.3 and 16.4 in the CUPE 4600 (Unit 2) Collective Agreement, the posted vacancies listed above are first offered to applicants meeting the incumbency criterion.
