COURSE PREREQUISITES FOR 2000-level FREN COURSES

- 2. Complete FREN 1002
 - a. Must attain grade of C or higher
- 3. Complete FREN 1100 or FREN 1110
 - a. Must attain grade of C or higher

NOTE: If you are already a French speaker, you may be able to complete a <u>Placement Test</u> instead of the above courses. Please contact the <u>School of Linguistics</u> and <u>Language Studies</u> to request more information.

REQUIREMENTS FOR MENTION: FRANCAIS

- 1. Complete 1.0 credit in FREN 2100
- 2. Complete 1.0 credit in FREN 2202 and 2203, or FREN 2401
 - a. You can register in the above courses concurrently with FREN 2100
- 3. Complete 1.0 credit at the 2000 or 3000 level in law or legal studies taught in French at the university level, and approved by the Undergraduate Supervisor
 - a. This requirement generally requires completing courses at other universities, such as University of Ottawa, and may require an <u>exchange</u> or <u>Letter of Permission</u>
- **4.** In addition, for B.A. (Honours) Law, Combined B.A. (Honours) Law, or B.G.In.S. (Honours) with a Specialization in Global Law and Social Justice, complete **1.0 credit at the 4000 level in law or legal studies** taught in French at the university level, and approved by the Undergraduate Supervisor
 - a. This requirement generally requires completing courses at other universities, such as University of Ottawa, and may require an exchange or Letter of Permission
