WHO WE ARE

LERRN is the Local Engagement Refugee Research Network. We are a team of researchers and practitioners committed to **advancing protection and solutions with and for refugees**. Our Partnership Secretariat is based at Carleton University, and our programs are developed and implemented by 16 working groups, 80 partners in 18 countries around the world.

Our work is focused in the **Global South**, which hosts **85% of the world's refugees**, and responds to the needs and opportunities identified by our partners in major refugee-hosting countries.

We are generously supported by a Partnership Grant from the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, along with additional C\$2.5 million in contributions from our partner organizations to lead a transformative work on “Reimagining Responses to Forced Migration.”
