Remuneration: Course Instructors will be compensated a total of \$1,400 and will be reimbursed up to \$160 per course for in-class expenses. Both compensation and reimbursement are issued as a one payment upon completion of course delivery.

*Note: If you are co-instructing a course the \$1400 compensation payment will be split between instructors

The Mini-Course Program (MCP) is offered every year during the month of May. During that time, participating post-secondary institutions offer approximately 125 minicourses, drawing nearly 3000 students from grades 8 to 11 in Ontario, and secondary levels II to V in Quebec.

Mini-courses are offered in a variety of disciplines and topics. The courses are highly interactive; they combine brief presentations, practical exercises, laboratory exercises, group discussions and field expeditions.

Position summary:

Course Instructors should be faculty, staff or current graduate students. Course instructors will work in cooperation with the Manager of High School Outreach to provide a weeklong learning experience for (up to) 15-30 students in grade 8-11.

Course Instructors are responsible for developing an engaging course in a topic of their choice. These courses should include a mixture of short lectures and experiential learning activities. Instructors are required to be present for the entire week of MCP. The week-long course begins Monday morning, May 4, 2026, and ends Friday afternoon, May 8, 2026. The daily schedule starts at 9:00 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. with a one-hour lunch break. Instructors are not responsible for supervising the students during the lunch break.

Core responsibilities:

- Act as an ambassador for Carleton University and your program of study
- Promote and support students in developing their academic interest in attending postsecondary
- Teach and facilitate an engaging learning experience for students during the week of MCP
- Attend and participate in the MCP Instructor Virtual Training Tuesday, March 17, 2026, 10:00
 a.m. 12:00 p.m.
- Attend MCP Orientation and facilitate a course orientation on Sunday, May 3, 2026
- Support and enforce policies and safety guidelines set by MCP and Carleton University
- Submit attendance records for the course, twice daily, using the main MCP website
