

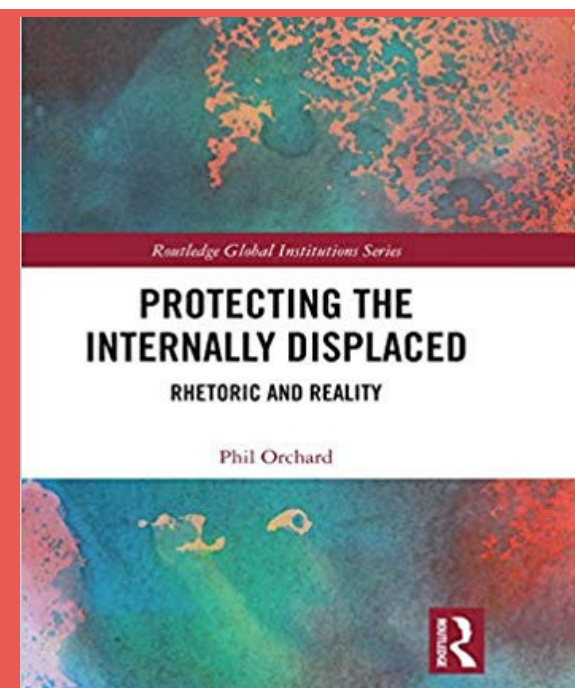

PROTECTING THE INTERNALLY DISPLACED: FROM RHETORIC TO REALITY

Today, there are over 40 million internally displaced persons (IDPs) globally. Refugees, outside of their own state, receive protection through an international refugee regime such as the UNHCR. By contrast, IDPs, though displaced for similar reasons, do not have the same protections since they remain within their own state.

Orchard's presentation will examine how the international response to the problem of IDP protection has changed over the past 20 years, and how legal protections have been introduced at the regional and domestic levels.
