

Supporting Black Leadership in the Nonprofit Sector: MPNL Award for Black Emerging Fundraising Professionals

With the initiative and support of alumna Muthoni Kariuki and members of the Black Canadian Fundraisers' Collective, this Award was established in 2020 to promote Black leadership within the philanthropic and nonprofit sector and to make professional education more equitable and inclusive.

Given annually by the Dean of Graduate and Postdoctoral Affairs on the recommendation of the Graduate Supervisor of the Master of Philanthropy and Nonprofit Leadership, the Award supports Black students entering or continuing in the MPNL program. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate their intention to pursue a career in professional fundraising.
