

## Accommodations and Travel Information for Presenters

Shepherd Symposium – “The Social and Cultural Study of Music: Then and Now”  
Carleton University, 24–25 November 2017, Ottawa, Canada

### Accommodations:

We have made arrangements with two downtown hotels where you will be able to get preferred rates offered to Carleton University:

The Albert at Bay Suite Hotel is located at 435 Albert Street, and is just a quick bus ride from Carleton (OC Transpo, route 4). Call 1-800-267-6644 or 1-613-238-8858 to make your reservations and ask for the Carleton University rate: \$135/night for regular rooms, \$155/night, king room, two bedroom suites are also available at a discount rate. (This is probably the best deal in the city, so book ASAP).\*

The Lord Elgin, 100 Elgin Street, is centrally located and steps away from the Parliament Buildings and other attractions. Call 1-800-267-4298, 1-613-235-3333, or go to [reservations@lordelgin.ca](mailto:reservations@lordelgin.ca) for reservations and ask for the Carleton preferred rate. The Elgin offers Carleton 15% off their best available rate at the time of booking (these rates fluctuate, however, according to time of year, demand, etc.).\*

**\* Please note that November 26<sup>th</sup> is Grey Cup night in Ottawa so room availability on both Saturday night, the 25<sup>th</sup>, and Sunday, the 26<sup>th</sup>, may be limited and rates may be higher than usual at some locations; book soon!** Carleton is accessible by public transport from most city hotels so you may want to search various web-based booking services to see if you can get comparable deals.

### Travel:

Within Canada, travel to Ottawa can be arranged by air, train or bus services. If you are traveling from outside Canada, and need to take connecting flights, **you may want to book your connections through either Montreal or Toronto:** the Symposium takes place during the week of American Thanksgiving and airports in the USA will be unusually busy; connecting through the US may result in flight delays.

Carleton University is a short ride from the Ottawa International Airport, so if you plan to leave the city immediately following the Symposium on Saturday night, it should be possible to make your connections on just about any evening flight.
