War is one of history's great forces. Along with such factors as economics, demography, social and political institutions, and ideas, it has shaped human societies and their interrelationships. This lecture will examine the ways in which wars have affected the modern world and how in turn changes in society have affected war.



Margaret MacMillan (Toronto and Oxford) is a professor of History at the University of Toronto and an emeritus professor of International History at Oxford University. Her research specializes in British imperial history and the international history of the 19th and 20th centuries. Publications include *War: How Conflict Shaped Us*, *Paris 1919*, and *The War that Ended Peace*. She is an honorary Fellow of the British Academy, a Companion of the Order of Canada and a Companion of Honour (UK).
