NPSIA MA/JD PROGRAM OVERVIEW

As a NPSIA student you are governed by the regulations of <u>the Office of Graduate Studies</u>, the <u>Faculty of Public and Global Affairs</u> (FPGA), and the <u>Graduate Calendar</u> requirements for the term of admission. You must also abide by Carleton University's <u>Student Rights and Responsibilities Policy</u>.

Please ensure that you are aware of <u>program completion requirements</u>, and consult Carleton's Graduate Studies <u>Calendar</u> for specific and up-to-date information on NPSIA's program.

MA/JD Program Summary

NPSIA is a 5.0 credit MA program.

MA/JD students can complete 5.0 credits in one of two ways: through **Coursework** and with a **Research Essay.** Please consult the NPSIA program pathway for our recommendations for student progression through the program.

In their first year of study, NPSIA MA/JD full-time students must complete the mandatory INAF courses in Statistics (INAF 5016), Policy (INAF 5017), Law (INAF 5018), and their economics field requirement.

MA/JD students must complete INAF 5509 Law, Politics and Economics in their third or fourth year of study.

NPSIA offers <u>eight fields</u>, each with a designated economics course, except for the IEP field which has two designated economics courses. Your letter of offer will indicate your field of admission. To obtain a field designation on your transcript, you must take 1.5 designated field courses. Students can complete their degree requirements without a field designation.


Designated field courses are listed in the <u>graduate calendar</u>. Students are given priority in their field's designated classes.

NPSIA also offers <u>five collaborative specializations</u>. We will send an application form for these collaborative specializations in July. If you are interested, please apply before the first week of classes. Some collaborative specializations have required classes you must take in your first term at NPSIA.

All non-NPSIA classes require pre-authorization from the MA Associate Director to count towards your degree. Please see the FAQs for the criteria for approval of non-NPSIA classes.

NPSIA has a <u>second language requirement</u>. Please consult our guidelines for the various ways in which this requirement can be fulfilled.

Note that NPSIA MA/JD students are eligible to apply for Carleton's <u>Coop Program</u> for the summer after completion of their NPSIA courses. Students must have completed 3.0 full credits, including their required courses (INAF 5017, INAF 5018, INAF 5016 and their designated economics course or courses in the case of the IEP field) to be eligible to participate in Coop.



REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Course Schedule

The Fall 2025 and Winter 2026 schedule will be posted on Carleton Central on May 26, 2025. Review the course listings prior to registration as the course schedule is subject to change.

Registration Steps

Students register for courses electronically through <u>Carleton Central</u>. Familiarize yourself with Carleton Central as it will be your one-stop service for registration, student records, admission, and tuition fee information.

→ NOTE: Please register for <u>BOTH</u> your Fall and Winter courses when registration opens in July.

Conditional Admission

If you received a conditional offer of admission, these conditions need to be removed before you can register (July 8-11). If conditions remain, you may face a delay in the registration process.

Economics Prerequisite

For those of you who have a condition to complete the economics prerequisite(s), this condition <u>will</u> <u>not</u> affect your ability to register (see note below). Please plan to have the economics prerequisites completed by the first day of your NPSIA program, as stated in your Offer of Admission.

→ ECONOMICS PREREQUISITE: You must email us by June 20 indicating that you are registered in your micro/macro course(s) and provide information on your final examination date(s).

Course Load

The normal course load for full-time MA-JD students completing the program via coursework is 2.0 credits in both Fall and Winter terms, excluding language courses.

If you would like to register in a language course that is 1.0 credit in the term you are registered, you will need to email the NPSIA MA Administrator (international to increase your credit limit.

Mandatory Classes

In their first year of study, NPSIA MA/JD students must complete the mandatory INAF courses in Statistics (INAF 5016), Policy (INAF 5017), Law (INAF 5018), and economics (various).

^{*} Times are assigned based on the last 2 digits of your Carleton University student number. You can find your time ticket information in Carleton Central under the tab 'Step 1: Registration – Getting Started!'.



Please note that Statistics, Policy and Law have associated tutorials. Students can register in the tutorial of their choice. Tutorial registration is on a first-come, first-served basis with no waitlists.

Field Designated Classes

When registration opens, only students enrolled in the field will be able to register for field designated courses for the first week of registration. For example, INAF 5706 is part of the HDHP field, so only HDHP students will be able to register in this course. If spaces remain, the course will open to non-HDHP students the following week. If the course is full once it is opened to non-field students, students can submit an override request to be added to a waitlist.

Elective Classes

Consider taking courses outside your field designation to familiarize yourself with the wide array of challenges and perspectives in the field of international affairs.

MA/JD students are NOT eligible to register for any of NPSIA's PhD courses (level 6000 courses), unless a student has received permission from the Associate Director (MA Program) and the course instructor.

Non-NPSIA Classes

Any non-NPSIA classes require advance authorization from the MA Associate Director and must meet the criteria outlined in our <u>FAQs</u>. Students must submit a request for non-NPSIA courses using this <u>form</u>.

Last Day for Registration

September 16, 2025 is the last day to register, change courses or sections for the Fall term. A list of other important University Dates can be found <u>here</u>.

Fees

For Fall 2025, tuition is due by August 25, 2025. Unpaid accounts will result in a late fee.

Student Status


Students who enter the program as full-time students are charged full-time student fees regardless of the number of courses in which they are enrolled.

Students must be registered as full-time students to access funding, including TA assignments.

If students want to change their status to part-time – either temporarily or permanently - they must meet the requirements for this change of status (see FAQs) and apply for a change in status.

Students will lose their student status if they remain unregistered for three continuous terms (twelve months).

You must contact the MA Administrator to request to be moved to part-time status by filling out a Registration Change Form.



ORIENTATION

The Office of Graduate Studies will host an <u>academic orientation</u> for new graduate students on the afternoon of **Tuesday, September 2, 2025**.

NPSIA's orientation will be held at 9 am on Wednesday September 3, 2025.

You will receive a detailed orientation program prior to the first week of classes. Please consult the orientation program carefully as mandatory sessions may be added.

Fall classes for NPSIA will begin after orientation on Wednesday, September 3, 2025.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

A Few Things to Remember:

- 1. **What is a Field Course?** A field course is a class that is assigned to a specific field. Please see the <u>Graduate Calendar</u> for the list of field courses being offered this year. Students only have priority registration in their own field courses.
- 2. **What is an Elective Course?** An elective is a course that is not part of any field and all students are eligible to take. After 1.5 credits of field courses, all field courses will count as elective credit.
- 3. **Do I need to complete a second language requirement while in the program?** Yes, all students must complete a <u>second language requirement</u> to graduate. If you choose to complete this option via course work, so long as you are paying full-time fees, the cost of the course will be covered.
- 4. **What happens if the course I want is listed as "Full"?** You can submit an <u>override request</u> to be considered for a waitlist.
- 5. I have a conditional offer of admission and can't register. What do I do? You will not be able to register until you have met all your conditions (official undergraduate transcript and/or completion of micro/macroeconomics courses). Please arrange for them to be cleared as soon as possible.
