Course Description

This course is an introduction to understanding, assessing, and formulating ethical arguments concerning controversial issues. Particular issues studied, such as world hunger, capital punishment, abortion, animal rights, and terrorism may vary each time the course is offered.

Learning Outcomes

This course is structured according to two goals. The first is to introduce students to the main ethical theories in contemporary Western ethical thought. The second is to bring students to think critically about contemporary ethical and social issues. Accordingly, the class is divided into two units. The first is titled Ethics in Theory and introduces students to different theoretical frameworks for reasoning about ethical and social issues. The second is on Ethics in Practice. Its purpose is to apply the theoretical frameworks learned in the first unit to pressing ethical and social issues, including euthanasia, animal treatment, abortion, racial and sexual discrimination, freedom of speech, and economic justice.

Course Materials

Readings for the course are taken from two different textbooks, listed below. Both are available for free online via the Carleton Library website. *There is no need to purchase any books for this class.* Links to relevant readings will be posted on CULearn.

Course Requirements

Evaluation:
