ASSIGNMENTS

Starting in 3rd week, the first hour of each seminar will be taken up with discussion of a student paper. *PAPERS MUST BE CIRCULATED IN ADVANCE*. If we have more than ten students, which we won't know for a couple of weeks, we will make some arrangement. Perhaps we can add an hour a few weeks or add a seminar on Dec. 8th. The final hour will be an introduction to the topic of the seminar the following week.

Students will also do a final term paper, which will usually be a rewrite of the seminar paper, responding to comments and doing a substantial exploration of the secondary literature.

Grades will be assigned as follows:

Seminar Presentation	30%
Final Paper	50%
Seminar Participation	20%

I am treating the final paper as a take-home exam, which means that it is due Wednesday, December 19th.

Assignments:

Unless specifically told otherwise by their instructors, students:

- must not use a plastic or cardboard cover or paper clips

- must include the following in the lower right corner of the cover sheet:
 - student name
 - student number
 - course number and section
 - instructor's name
- The Philosophy Department does not accept assignments by FAX. You may send them by courier, if necessary.
- No assignments will be accepted after the last day for handing in term work – see dates in next column.
- Assignments handed in through the essay box (just inside the glass doors, Paterson Hall, Floor 3A) must be dropped into the box by **4:15** on a regular business day in order to be date-stamped with that day's date. Assignments handed in after 4:15 or on a non-business day will be stamped as having been handed in on the next business day.
- Students are required to keep copies of their assignments. If your paper is lost at any point, you will be considered not to have submitted it if you cannot produce a copy immediately on request.
