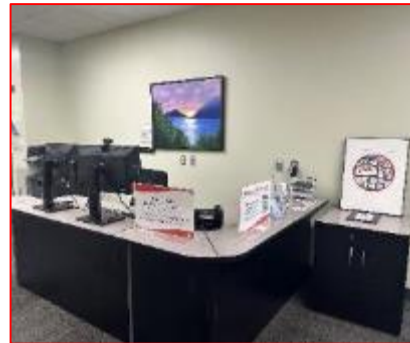

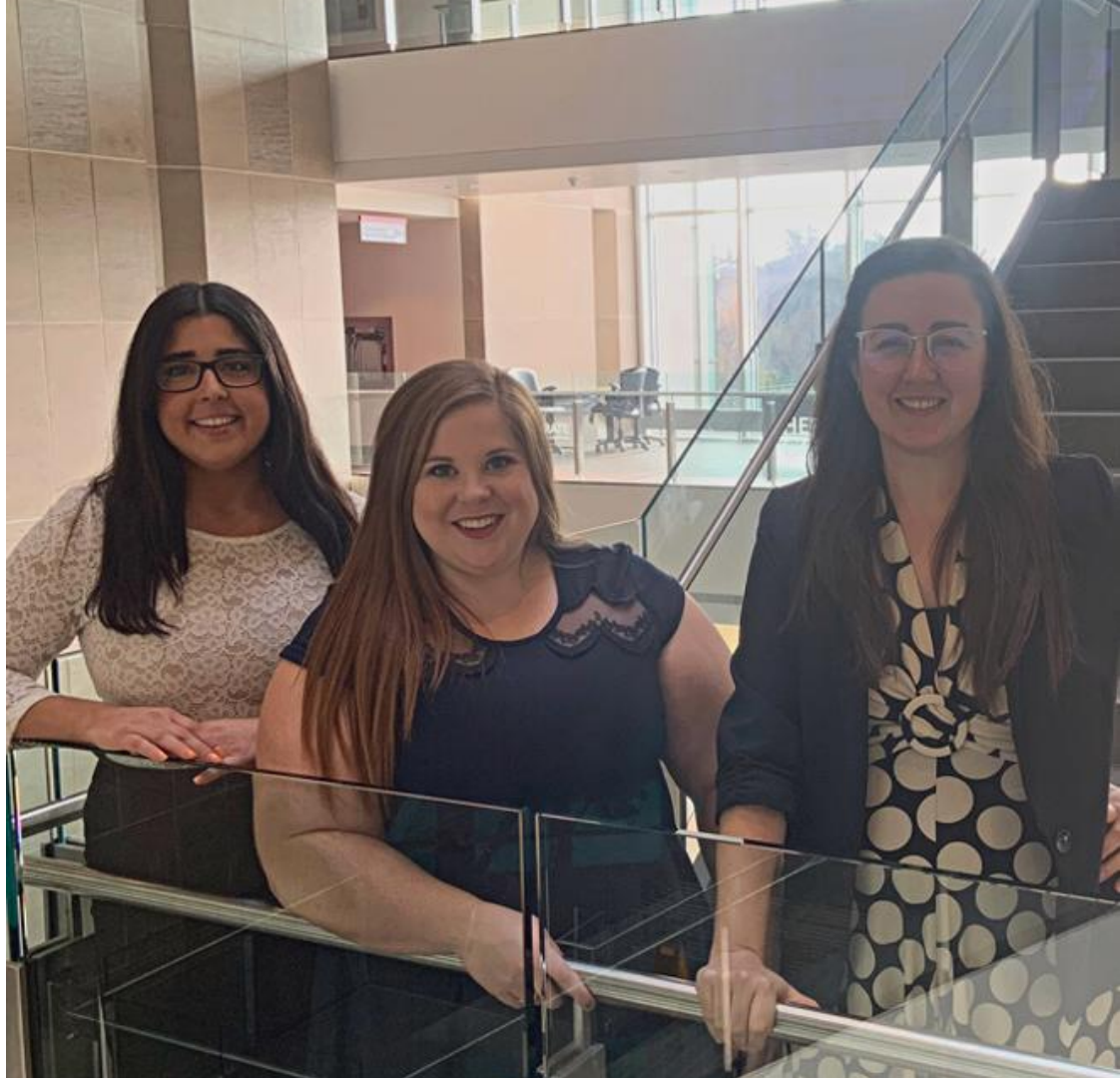

Health and Counselling Services

Our Team

- Primary Care Physicians/Nurse Practitioners

Health and Counselling Services

- **Medical Clinic**

- Primary Care (pap smears, IUD insertions, etc.)
- Same day/Urgent care, doctor visits (sore throat, infections, acute injuries etc.)
- Vaccines (Gardasil, Hepatitis A&B, Vitamin B12, Hormone injections etc.)
- STI testing
- Mental Health Assessments and follow ups

Counselling

- Short-term counselling is available to students struggling with many different problems like anxiety, depression, relationship problems, sexual violence, and personal and academic stress. The students first appointment will be with an experienced intake counsellor over the phone who will explore their needs, and help navigate them to the appropriate resources.

Intake Process for Counselling

- You can book online through the Health and Counselling website. An intake form and consent form will be sent to you to be completed through a secure portal *before* your appointment
- The Intake Counsellor will call you to discuss appropriate supports based on unique concerns, do a risk assessment and provide resources while awaiting counselling
- Intake calls on average are 30 minutes
- If a student is not sure counselling is for them or if they are looking for additional resources give us a call!

Same-Day/Crisis/Urgent Counselling Support

- HCS aims to be as accessible to students and understands students may face situational stressors which may require same-day support.
- Same-day appointments are set-aside each day for students to access who may be facing concerns requiring immediate support-reserved for crisis and urgent concerns only
- The Intake Counsellor/Crisis Counsellor will navigate available resources with students to find the most appropriate form of support
- These may be booked by calling our clinic or walking in

Confidentiality

- Health and Counselling Services (HCS) is legally required to keep health information confidential.
- HCS will not release any information without written permission from the student. The limits to confidentiality are:
 - To protect a student or others from immediate harm
 - When ordered by a court to do so (subpoena);
 - Disclosure of abuse or neglect of someone under the age of 17 years old
