



Susan Scott Scholarship

Awarded annually on the recommendation of the Paul Menton Centre to an outstanding undergraduate student entering or proceeding from one year to another at Carleton University. Eligible students will have a permanent disability and be registered with the Paul Menton Centre and must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada. Preference will be given to a female student. Established by CFUW-Ottawa Club at the request of Fran Harding and funded through generous donations from Fran and other CFUW-Ottawa Club members. It is named in honour of Susan Scott Parker, a Canadian, who is an advocate for the rights of disabled persons in the United Kingdom. Revised in 2017.

The scholarship is valued at \$4000. The amount can vary from year to year.

Eligibility Criteria

- Outstanding academic achievement
- Undergraduate student entering or proceeding from one year to another in academic program at Carleton University
- A documented permanent disability
- Registration with the Paul Menton Centre
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Preference given to a female student

Deadline: August 31; no late applications will be considered.
