This scholarship may be renewable for up to 3 consecutive years of full-time enrolment at a value of \$6,000 per year. Established in 2019 by the Walker Wood Foundation. Revised 2023.

This award may be renewed for 3 consecutive years of full-time enrolment (minimum of 3.0 credits over the Fall/Winter session). This award is valued at up to \$6,000 the first year and renewable at \$6,000 for 3 years.

- Applicant must be registered with the Paul Menton Center
- · Applicant must demonstrate good academic standing

- · Applicant must demonstrate financial need
- Preference will be given to candidates who demonstrate academic promise and leadership, participation in extracurricular secondary school activities or community service
- Preference may be given to students who are passionate about advocating for disabilities
