Carleton University's Clayton H. Riddell Masters of Political Management was launched in 2011 and is an important first for Canada. Programs in applied political skills and analysis had existed at other prestigious post-secondary institutions, including Fordham University in New York City and George Washington University in Washington, D.C. The Riddell program was explicitly designed to inform and bolster electoral politics and parliamentary democracy in Canada and beyond.

Its twin goals are to provide an exhilarating and indispensable education for those who will go on to occupy positions of responsibility in Canadian politics, and in so doing to improve the political process for all Canadians.

The Riddell program provides an intensive professional education that prepares its graduates for positions of responsibility and authority in electoral,

legislative, and advocacy politics: as political staff to cabinet ministers and elected representatives; strategists and tacticians for political parties; campaign managers and communication advisers; and organizers for civil society agencies and grassroots movements.

The premiere event every spring is the Riddell Reception, which invites friends of the program to attend a unique presentation on the state of Canadian politics. 

Chantal Hébert is a freelance political columnist featured on radio, television and in print in French and English. That includes weekly participation on the political panel *At Issue* on the CBC's *The National* and Peter Mansbridge's *Good Talk* podcast on SiriusXM. She served as parliamentary bureau chief for *Le Devoir* and *La Presse* before becoming a political columnist for the *Toronto Star*.



Bruce Anderson

Bruce Anderson has been one of Canada's leading market and opinion researchers for over 30 years and a leading commentator and counsellor on current events and political affairs in Canada. Bruce was a founding partner of the Earnscliffe Strategy Group and helped lead that company for 15 years. He also helped to found spark*advocacy, Canada's leading public affairs boutique, and served as Chairman of Abacus Data.

GOOD TALK



The Bridge is a daily podcast that explores the various issues of the day, covering topics such as politics, public health, technology, and more. The Bridge was started as a nightly podcast during the 2019 Canadian election and went daily when the COVID-19 pandemic hit. It broadcasts first on SiriusXM Canada Channel 167, “Canada Talks.” It’s available at noon and 5 PM Eastern. It’s also available on Apple Podcasts and Spotify once its initial airing on SiriusXM Canada is complete.
