The Centre for Research and Education on Women and Work (CREWW) https://carleton.ca/creww/ is seeking a passionate Postdoctoral Research Fellow interested in research related to gender, ethnic and cultural diversity. CREWW is an organized research unit housed within the Sprott School of Business, Carleton University. The Centre's mission is "to facilitate and disseminate research on women and work to both academics and the broader community." CREWW is looking to expand it research capacity around issues arising at the intersection of gender and mobility, exploring how the interplay of multiple social categories (gender, race, ethnicity, class, etc.) converge in the experience of women. We are looking for a highly motivated, self-driven, and independent candidate for a **2-year term**. The successful candidate will play a key role in the Centre's grant writing efforts as well as support and participate in existing research projects related to women and work, women immigrants, diversity and inclusion. The successful candidate will demonstrate ability and experience in all stages of research, including expertise in research design, the management of research projects, and report writing. The successful candidate will be expected to prepare manuscripts for publications in peer reviewed journals, and provide support in the submission of grant proposals to external funding agencies. The candidate is expected to demonstrate enthusiasm about participating in interdisciplinary research, and work collaboratively with other members of the department, Sprott staff, and external stakeholders.

CREWW is highly committed to the professional development of the PDF, who will help to shape the direction of the research projects and engage as a collaborator and co-author. This position provides opportunities for publication and experience with grant writing and project management.

Salary

Qualifications

The ideal applicants for a Postdoctoral Fellowship at CREWW will have:

- Proficiency in quantitative methodology as demonstrated by published work and/or course work;
- Excellent academic writing skills in English as demonstrated by published work and/or course work;
- Project management skills;
- Ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues, decision makers and the scientific community

Experience conducting research related to diversity and inclusion and grant writing experience are not required but desirable assets.
