Application to the Sprott PhD in Management - Admission Requirements

- Bachelor and Master's degree in Business or a related field with a minimum of A- (i.e. 80%)
- GMAT (Graduate Management Admissions Test) score of at least 600
- Proficiency in English
- Basic knowledge of statistics and at least two areas of management:
(accounting, entrepreneurship, finance, information systems, international business, management, marketing, supply chain management)
- A number of years of work experience is desirable

Admission into the PhD program will be judged primarily on the applicant's ability to undertake research successfully and her/his prospects for completion of the program.

Application to the Sprott MSc in Management - Admission Requirements

- Honours Bachelor of Commerce degree (or equivalent, e.g. 4-year Commerce, Bachelor of Business Administration or similar degrees) with a minimum of B+
- GMAT (Graduate Management Admissions Test) score of at least 600
- Proficiency in English
- Applicants who do not meet the normal requirements for admission may be required to complete additional courses, extra to the normal program requirements.

Admission into the MSc program will be judged primarily on the applicant's potential to undertake research successfully and her/his prospects for completion of the program.

2. Identify a research issue or question you would like to pursue.
3. Why do you want a PhD/MSc in Management degree?
Please indicate if you want a career in: academia, public service, private sector or non-profits.
4. Why have you chosen the Sprott School of Business to pursue the degree and why is the school a good fit for you personally?
5. Have you contacted (a) faculty member(s) at Sprott? **
If yes, please indicate which one(s).
If no, please identify which one(s) would best match your research interest.
Please describe how you see yourself fitting into the research activities of the Sprott faculty.
6. Describe 2 of your most substantial career / academic accomplishments.
7. How do you plan to finance your PhD/MSc degree?
8. Are you applying to other PhD/MSc programs?
If yes, please indicate which one(s).
9. Please add additional information that is relevant to your application.
