COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTORS STATEMENT

PSYC 2002 covers the basics of data analysis. It will build on the descriptive statistics covered in PSYC 2001 but the major focus is on inferential statistics. Inferential statistics encompass a variety of procedures for deciding if results obtained in a study are due to chance or not. You will learn how to use these statistics as well as learn their underlying conceptual basis. You also will learn how to use Excel (or other spreadsheet) to do statistical calculations. The course will be offered with asynchronous lectures; I will use the scheduled lecture times for online office hours.
