COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This survey course provides students with an overview of the biological, social, and cognitive processes that occur during the developmental periods of adolescence and emerging adulthood. Course content includes the developmental changes which take place during adolescence, with a focus on changes that occur during emerging adulthood (18-29 years of age). A major goal of the course is for students to critically examine the implications of these changes for growth and development while applying theories and discussions to relevant community/real world events that impact individuals.

This course will be fully **asynchronous** but highly **structured** to keep students progressing through the content.

Please note that the midterm will take place during our regularly scheduled class time on Friday from 11:35 a.m. - 2:25 p.m. The final exam will be scheduled during the formal exam period from April 16-27, 2021.

EVALUATION
