## COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course introduces you to the field of investigative interviewing. Investigative interviewing is arguably the most fundamental aspect of many criminal investigations because it elicits the information from witnesses, victims, and suspects that is required to successfully resolve cases. In this course, we will discuss and critically evaluate such topics as memory processes, suggestibility, compliance, models of interrogation and interviewing (e.g., Reid, PEACE), the Cognitive Interview, and child interviewing.
