COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This seminar will focus on theory, conceptualization, and measurement of a variety of cognitions (such as attitudes, code of the street, cognitive distortions, honour ideology, moral disengagement, and hostile attributions) thought to be relevant for explaining, predicting, and reducing violent behaviour; the role those cognitions may play in violent behaviour; and interventions designed to ameliorate those cognitions. It will cover some different types of violence (such as general violence, intimate partner violence, and sexual violence).

A typical class will consist of lecture and discussion of the assigned readings.

All classes for this seminar will be in-person on campus.
