PSYC 1002 is designed to provide B. Comm. students with an overview of psychology as a social science. Psychology is the scientific study of the mind and behaviour (i.e., our thoughts, feelings, and behaviours). You'll examine psychological research and theories related to a diverse range of topics, such as human development, personality, social behaviour, stress, coping, and health to psychological disorders, and treatment options. In PSYC 1002 we will focus on recent research being conducted in psychology and on the application of that research in the real world. You will explore evolving concepts and learn about the methods used within each domain to better understand, evaluate, and critically apply current research to everyday situations. Psychology is a broad discipline with many opportunities to develop a deeper understanding of human behaviour.
