COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

Welcome to PSYC 1002G! My name is Jessica Gledhill and I am a contract Instructor with the Department of Psychology. Additionally, I am a Registered Psychotherapist with a private practice in the Ottawa Valley. I am looking forward to spending the semester with you, learning about the world of Psychology!

This course is intended as a continuation from the knowledge learned in PSYC 1001. The purpose of this course is to act as a “survey” of the field of psychology – offering you the opportunity to sample different “sub-categories” within the field.

The prerequisite for this course is PSYC 1001.

After successfully completing PSYC 1001 and 1002, you will have satisfied the prerequisites for 2nd year courses in PSYC.
