## COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTORS STATEMENT

This course builds on the material covered in PSYC 2002. You will review statistical tests such as t-tests, ANOVA and regression that were introduced in PSYC 2002 and gain a more in depth understanding these techniques. By the end of this course, you will have a good working knowledge of SPSS. This course will require you to calculate, by hand, statistical tests and be able to interpret computer output generated by SPSS. Additionally, there will be a focus on communicating these results appropriately. The goal of this course is to provide you with the ability to understand and synthesise other researchers results along with your own. This will be excellent preparation for those students planning to complete either the honours project or an honours thesis.
