COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course is designed to be very interactive and learn 'hands on' in terms of both the course and lab instruction.

This course has two main goals. First, the course will explore various developmental psychology topics in a seminar-style course. To achieve this goal, the course will meet during scheduled class times to discuss assigned research articles. The second main goal of this course is to help prepare students to complete an honours thesis in psychology. To meet this second goal, the course will involve developing and completing a quantitative research project (i.e., developing hypotheses and a research design, conducting data analysis, writing an APA-style research report, etc.) in the field of developmental psychology.
