COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

The course is intended to provide an overview of theory and research in areas of atypical cognitive, behavioural, and emotional development in children, including topics related to neurodiverse development, perceptual or cognitive differences, and behavioural and socio-emotional disorders.
