COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

The course is intended to provide an overview of theory and research in areas of atypical physical, behavioural, and emotional development in children, including topics related to neurodiverse development, perceptual or cognitive impairments, and behavioural and socioemotional disorders. The course will include lecture materials drawn from the textbook, research literature, videos, and various empirical studies and guests presented in class.

Instruction will consist of weekly pre-recorded lectures that will be posted to Brightspace. **The midterm and final exam for the course will be held in person at Carleton University**. The dates, times, and location on campus of the in-person assessments are TBD.
