COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

Welcome to the fascinating world of psychopathy. This seminar will focus on the assessment, empirical, and theoretical research on psychopathy. What is psychopathy? How do you measure psychopathic traits? Are there "successful" psychopaths? Does treatment work with psychopaths? What is the impact of being involved with a psychopath? These are the types of questions we will be discussing. This seminar is designed to familiarize students with the fundamentals of research and theory on psychopathy and to develop critical thinking skills. Each week there will be readings on key topics and a review of the methodology commonly used in research. You will have the opportunity to learn how to score someone on psychopathic traits and examine a specific psychopathy topic in detail.
