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### COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTOR'S STATEMENT

This course is intended to provide students with a framework for critically understanding and addressing ethical issues in research, teaching and, to some extent, practice. In-class activities and case-based learning will be used to integrate key issues regarding ethics for scientists. Topics include: Tri-Council guidelines, mentoring, publications and authorship, data ownership, peer review, human participants and conflicts of interest, among other things.
