COURSE DESCRIPTION/INSTRUCTORS STATEMENT

The goal of this course is to help you extend your breadth of knowledge in areas of psychology beyond your main area of research/ dissertation and to advance academic skills.

This course will meet Thursdays 2:30pm-4:00pm in person. The meetings include a lecture series of speakers both from our department and from other universities with talks targeting different areas of psychology (e.g., cognitive, social, personality, health, developmental, applied, forensic). The meetings also include workshops on a variety of practical academic skills that may be useful to your research career.

Three brief assignments are associated with the workshops (mandatory for PhD students only). Fall term assignments: Grants and Scholarships, Qualitative and mixed methods research, Review one of the presentations and tie to your own research
